Do shorter days mean winter blues?

The winter blahs ...

we've all suffered from them. Shorter days, cold weather, and cabin fever can make anyone feel a little down, but for some winter blues are a serious condition.

"The shorter days and lack of light can cause physical changes in certain people. They become lethargic, have excessive daytime sleepiness, and experience an increased craving for carbohydrates. All of these symptoms are directly related to *Seasonal Affective Disorder*," said Dr. Don Chesler, chairman of the department of psychiatry at St. Anthony Hospital.

Seasonal Affective Disorder or SAD is a form of depression caused by the inability to adjust to the shorter days in winter. The pineal body, located in the center of the brain, is the body's daily and seasonal time clock. If the body doesn't get enough light, the pineal body secretes differently causing a neurotransmitter change which can result in SAD.

Studies show that as many as four to six of every 100 people may have winter depression, while another 10 to 20 percent experience mild SAD. Women have a higher occurrence of SAD and although

some children and teenagers get SAD, it usually doesn't start in people younger than 20.

Geographic location can also play a factor, since SAD is seven times more common in Washington than in Florida.

Chesler suggests that regular aerobic exercise, balanced diet, and eating carbohydrates in moderation are useful in combating winter depression or SAD. Greater exposure even to normal indoor light may help, but with serious cases of SAD light therapy might be used.

"The light therapy used to treat SAD is generally a broad spectrum, fully electromagnetic visible light of 2500 lux. Light therapy does require a time commitment, often up to three hours per day," said Chesler. "But many people find that medication helps them just as

much as light therapy."

He also states that tanning beds shouldn't be used to treat SAD, as the light sources in tanning beds are high in ultraviolet (UV) rays, which harm both your eyes and skin.

So how can you tell if winter blues are really SAD? Chesler says that for someone to have full-blown Seasonal Affective Disorder, there should be pattern of symptoms during at least two consecutive winters.

"Generally, people don't seek treatment for SAD. They often diagnose themselves and muddle through the winter months the best they can. But if someone experiences symptoms that affect their lifestyle or work, it is important to seek treatment," said Chesler."

Planned giving: Charitable bequest

Many Junior League members have the desire to financially support Junior League of Oklahoma City beyond the financial requirements of membership. Junior League of Oklahoma City is making this possible through its recently launched **Planned Giving program**. Planned giving is a process of designing charitable gifts so that the donor can realize her philanthropic objectives while maximizing tax and other financial benefits.

One type of planned gift is a **Charitable Bequest**, which is generally stated in a Last Will & Testament or in a Revocable Living Trust. This type of gift often allows

the donor to make larger charitable gifts than may be possible or desired during her lifetime. An advantage of this type of gift is that it is revocable during the grantor’s lifetime, thus providing a hedge against unforeseen circumstances or events. In effect, the bequest operates like a post-dated check payable only after death.

Another advantage is that the donor’s estate would be reduced by the value of the gift. Estates valued at more than \$1 million during the years 2002 and 2003 may be subject to estate tax.

A charitable bequest in a Last Will & Testament or Revocable Living Trust may be stated as a

specific amount, as a specific real or personal property, or as a percentage of assets remaining after the payment of final expenses.

Consultation with your attorney, tax accountant, or financial planner is advised. We encourage you to consider naming Junior League of Oklahoma City as a charitable beneficiary of any part of your estate in your will or revocable trust document. If you do so, or if you have already done so, we would like to know! 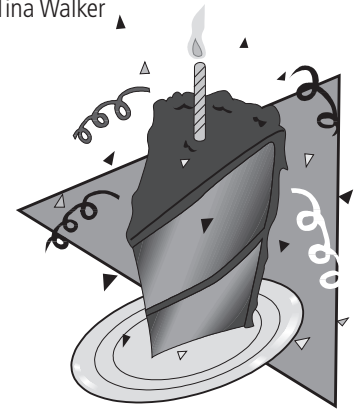
